They like to nest in tree cavities, on top of broken-off trees, or sometimes in nests left by other animals.



Believe it or not, these owls are not fussy eaters at all. Their diet mainly consists of small mammals like flying squirrels, woodrats, and mice, but they also eat some birds and insects. These owls have a special way of hunting, they sit quietly on a perch and

wait for their prey, then swoop down to catch it. And it's not all about eating and sleeping, these owls also have a fascinating life cycle. They lay eggs once a year, and the female takes care of the eggs while the male brings her food.
