They prefer freshwater habitats like rivers, lakes, and marshes where they can camouflage and wait for their prey. But do you know, during the dry season when their watery homes shrink, they can dig burrows in the mud to stay cool and hydrated - they are smart, aren't they?

Broad-snouted caimans lay eggs, and the mother guards her nest until the babies, called hatchlings, are born. Humans, on the other hand, have different relationships with these creatures; some people see them as dangerous while others protect them as important parts of the ecosystem.
